

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

Post-study work rights - you could receive a post-study work (PSW) visa of up to six years* on the completion of your studies when living and working in Perth. This is one year longer than Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane.



UWA College English language courses are provided by The Centre for English Language Teaching (CELT) at UWA. If you need to improve your English skills for a pathway program, CELT offers high-quality English language tuition in a supportive and friendly environment.

How can I improve my English skills?

CELT's Language and Communication Essentials program is designed to improve your English language skills and prepare you for further academic study at UWA College. This language program can be packaged with your chosen UWA College pathway and UWA degree, giving you everything you need under a single study plan and visa so you won't have to take another language test on completion.

What will I learn?

You'll learn English skills through:

- · discussing interesting topics and taking part in conversations
- reading and understanding English texts
- writing clearly and accurately
- listening to different varieties of spoken English
- learning how to use correct grammar and vocabulary.




